The show will be visiting some of the country's largest theatres for more than a year and we'll let you have the details in our next newsletter. We're going to miss her and our audiences clearly loved her too, but it gives us the opportunity to bring some new thinking to the production and rehearsals are already under way. Rebecca trained at the Birmingham School of Acting and her theatre work includes A Midsummer Night's Dream (Courtyard Theatre, London), With a Clock in Mind (Troubadour Theatre, London), An Impossible Dream of Life (Hôtel Teatro) and The Snow Dog (Edinburgh Pleasance). She has also toured extensively with the leading theatre company for young people, Full House, and starred in the 2013 movie I'm Still Here and she can also be seen in The Smoke, Man in The Mirror and the sci-fi movie, Embrace Eternity. She also pops up in commercials for Birdseye and Age UK!

Whilst the show will remain largely the same, we're also delighted to welcome Jame Le Lacheur who will direct the Autumn version and promises to bring in some new touches. James has just finished a year in Harry Potter and the Cursed Child (Palace Theatre) and he has also appeared in James and the Giant Peach (Colchester Mercury Theatre), and Antony and Cleopatra (Shakespeare's Globe). He can currently be seen in the forthcoming film All the Money in the World, directed by Ridley Scott, and more than a dozen shorts, music videos and commercials. He has directed for his own company, Fast Parson Theatre, Emotion Pictures Theatre's Last Petal Falling and the upcoming feature film Still Love.
